

AGREEMENT ON ACADEMIC EXCHANGE
between
EWHA WOMANS UNIVERSITY'S COLLEGE OF NURSING SCIENCE
And KHON KAEN UNIVERSITY'S FACULTY OF NURSING

In view of the significant contribution expected to be made by student and faculty exchange programs between Ewha Womans University's College of Nursing Science and Khon Khan University's Faculty of Nursing toward the progress of learning as well as the promotion of international understanding, it is agreed as follows:

- I. Both Colleges shall provide all possible opportunities available on their respective campuses for the students from abroad to enroll in undergraduate and graduate programs as exchanged under this Agreement.
- II. Both Colleges agree to establish a joint mechanism for the support of faculty exchanges and collaboration between the two Colleges. Faculty exchanges may encompass teaching and/or cooperative research.
- III. Both Colleges shall promote other academic activities which enhance the above mentioned goals.

This Agreement shall take effect for an indefinite period from the day the representatives of both Colleges institutions affix their signatures. The Agreement is subject to revision, renewal and cancellation by mutual consent at least six months in advance in writing given by either College to the other. An Addendum on Agreement on Academic Exchange is attached as both parties hereto and hereof have agreed.

ADDENDUM TO THE AGREEMENT ON ACADEMIC EXCHANGE
between
EWHA WOMANS UNIVERSITY'S COLLEGE OF NURSING SCIENCE
And KHON KAEN UNIVERSITY'S FACULTY OF NURSING

In as much as an Agreement is reached between Ewha Womans University's College of Nursing Science and Khon Khan University's Faculty of Nursing relating to their student and faculty exchange, the following understanding is applied.

STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

1. Each year, during the term of the Addendum, both colleges may send up to two full time undergraduate and/or graduate students. The preferred length of stay will be not exceeding twelve months and not be less than six months.
2. Each host college will waive only tuition and other fees incurred by the exchange student for registration and admission.
3. Both colleges shall arrange accommodation for the exchange students. The payment of housing costs and payment for all travel, medical insurance and subsistence costs shall be the responsibility of the exchange student and neither college shall be held liable for such charges.
4. Each exchange student is responsible for travel arrangements and visa. The host institution shall provide exchange students with any university certification needed to obtain a student visa for the full period of the exchange.
5. Students will be selected by their home institution on the basis of:
 - i. Academic excellence
 - ii. Seriousness of interest in the study proposed
 - iii. Adequate language competence. Ewha Womans University's students should have a minimum score of 570 on the TOEFL examination.
 - iv. Capacity to adjust to cross-cultural situations.

6. Each student selected for participating in this program will be admitted as a special (non-degree) student to the host institution upon submission of:
 - i. An application for admission
 - ii. An official college transcript
 - iii. A recommendation letter by the faculty or advisor
 - iv. Financial statement from bank
 - v. Health record statement

It is understood that students admitted under the terms of this Agreement will continue as candidates for degrees at their home institution, and will not be candidates for degrees of the host institution.

7. Exchange students at Ewha can take Asian Studies Courses taught in English, Korean Language Courses; courses taught in English offered at Graduate School of International Studies and Department of International Studies; and regular university courses taught in Korean (if the student has working knowledge of Korean language).
8. Academic credits earned in courses taken by the exchange student while studying at the host institution may be accepted by the student's home institution, provided that such be judged as appropriate by the latter. At the end of the academic year, each institution will provide the other with a final official transcript of the grades obtained by each exchange student.
9. Exchange students shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the host institution and country. They will also have the rights and privileges enjoyed by all students of the host university.
10. Exchange students will be required to be covered by health insurance as mandated by the regulations of the host institution and/or country.
11. This program will be coordinated by Host Institution's Name and the International Education Institute at Ewha Womans University.

FACULTY EXCHANGE PROGRAM

1. Both institutions will invite and exchange scholars (faculty, research personnel) in the field of interest to both parties.
2. Both institutions shall exchange and share materials related to educational and research interests.
3. Both institutions shall promote joint research activities and participation in conferences, symposia, serial lectures and seminars.
4. The host institution will be not responsible for the payment for these activities. However, this does not prevent both parties from making necessary arrangements to raise a special fund for this program.
5. Both institutions shall maintain continuous communication and coordination necessary to pursue definite plans for scientific cooperation.

The undersigned agree to these Bylaws on behalf their respective institutions.
