**MEMORANDUM OF ACTION
BETWEEN
HEALTH POLYTECHNIC OF MINISTRY OF HEALTH IN YOGYAKARTA
AND
FACULTY OF NURSING KHON KAEN UNIVERSITY**

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Today, Monday, February 12th, 2018 in Khon Kaen , the undersigned below:

Joko Susilo. SKM, M.Kes : Director of Health Polytechnic of Ministry of Health in Yogyakarta, in this case acting for and on behalf of Health Polytechnic of Ministry of Health in Yogyakarta, located on Tatabumi Street Number 3, Banyuraden, Gamping, Sleman, Daerah Istimewa Yogyakarta hereinafter referred to as **FIRST PARTY**

Assistant Professor Dr. Sauwamas Khunlan Theunnadee : Dean of Faculty of Nursing Khon Kaen University, in this case acting for and on behalf of Faculty of Nursing Khon Kaen University, located on Khon Kaen hereinafter referred to as **SECOND PARTY**.

FIRST PARTY and SECOND PARTY hereinafter referred to as **PARTIES**

This memorandum of action between the Health Polytechnic of Ministry of Health in Yogyakarta and Faculty of Nursing Khon Kaen University is intended to facilitate academic collaboration between the partner institutions. The linkage hereby formed shall further each partner institution's objectives as well as strengthen the mutual relationship between the partners.

PREAMBLE

Pursuing the same goals in the areas of learning; being committed to the direct application and recognition of the importance and the use of knowledge as a contributor to health development; having a reciprocal interest in constructing and developing relations of international cooperation;
The Parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1: OBJECTIVE

Health Polytechnic of Ministry of Health in Yogyakarta and Faculty of Nursing Khon Kaen University shall seek to establish forms of cooperation in teaching, science, management and culture that contribute to the development and consolidation of the ties of friendship between the two academic institutions and the two countries on the basis of the principles of equality and reciprocal benefit.
Cooperation between the Parties may be developed through:

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- a. collaboration in activities of particular scientific interest also through the sharing of experience in the use of complex technical/scientific in Nursing such as International Program, Maternity, Paediatric, Medical Surgical, Gerontology, Emergency and Disaster Management, Reproductive Health etc
- b. exchange publications and information; reviewer of journal;
- c. support for online courses;
- d. exchange of students, academic staff and supporting staff, cultural initiatives of common interest;
- e. development of joint research projects
- f. development of initiatives aimed at improving governance and management; other activities agreed by two institutions.

ARTICLE 2: SCOPE

This arrangement establishes a general partnership between the institutions to facilitate collaborations in one or more of the following academic activities: teaching, student exchange, lecture exchange, technology transfer, publication, joint projects and training. It is contemplated that any specific collaboration, including student exchanges, shall be subject to its own agreement not inconsistent with this general framework. The specific agreements should state, where appropriate, the institutional commitments and the terms and conditions of the exchange or collaboration. Each specific agreement shall be approved by each institution in accordance with its regular approval process.

Although this general arrangement does not limit the disciplines or programs that can take advantage of its terms, the partners recognize their common interests and strengths in (enter areas of common interests/strengths) which serve as the basis for this agreement. Other activities authorized by this agreement may involve any discipline to the extent that individuals at one institution are able to collaborate with persons with similar interests at the partner institution.

ARTICLE 3: RESPONSIBLE

THE PARTIES have obligations:

- (1) Providing fund for the memorandum of action of each party;
- (2) Providing human resources and experts within the scope of cooperation;
- (3) Providing facilities needed according to ability;

PARTIES have the right:

- (1) The parties facilitate the need for funds according to the agreement.
- (2) Utilizing human resources and experts in the framework of memorandum of action;
- (3) Using facilities and infrastructure to support activities during memorandum of action;

ARTICLE 4: COSTS

With the aim of carrying out the activities foreseen by this arrangement, the Parties shall raise the necessary economic resources within the limits of and in accordance with legislation in force in their countries. All costs shall be specified in the technical guidance/implementation instructions.

ARTICLE 5: DURATION



This memorandum of action will become effective immediately upon the date of the last required signature. It shall continue in effect for a period of five (5) years and may be extended by mutual agreement. During the term, the agreement may be terminated by either institution upon six-months written notification to the partner institution.

ARTICEL 6: RESOLVING DISPUTES

- (1) If there are any disagreements about the terms of this memorandum of action or the operation of programs authorized by this arrangement, both partners agree to refrain from unilateral action, to consult with each other, and to negotiate in good faith a mutually agreeable resolution.
- (2) The resolution of any disputes arising during the carrying out of any memorandum of action shall conform to the provisions established in the specific memorandum of action
- (3) In all cases, the present Academic Cooperation arrangement shall apply solely to the extent it does not contradict applicable national legislation.
- (4) The present Memorandum of Action is signed in 2 copies in English, and Indonesian and The Parties receive one copy in each language. In case of inconsistency of interpretation, the English text shall prevail over the language texts.

ARTICLE 7: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- (1) Specific Projects & Proper Approvals: Prior to implementing individual visits of faculty members, approval from each institution should be obtained in accordance with the normal processes of each institution.
- (2) The transfer of information, faculty, or staff for education, or related activities shall be proposed by both institutions through their faculties and units, in consultation with and approval of the appropriate institutional officials, and shall be the subject of a separate document.
- (3) Evaluation & Compliance: All specific projects to which this memorandum of action may lead shall provide a method by which they may be evaluated on a regular basis by the designated authorities of both institutions.
- (4) Non-Discrimination: Both institutions subscribe to the policy of equal opportunity and will not discriminate on the basis of gender, age, disability, race, color, religion, marital status, veteran's status, national or ethnic origin.


